How is information used to persuade and impact our beliefs and actions? How can people use media responsibly to amplify their voice?



Module 3: Power & Influence

Who has power and influence over policy in our communities? What considerations matter most when balancing the rights of the individual vs. the common good?



Module 4: Dialogue & Respect

How does civil discourse support democracy? How do we develop mutual understanding among people and communities when they disagree?



Module 5: Change & Impact

What role can youth play in creating social change? What civic actions have the most impact?
